Campbell County School Food Services have announced an amendment to its policy for serving meals to students under the National School Lunch / School Breakfast Programs for the 2018-2019 school year.

All students will be served lunch/breakfast at no charge at the following two sites:

Crossroads Elementary School and Alexandria Educational Center.

Important things to know for Crossroads and Alexandria Educational Center students:

- Children attending these sites will receive school breakfast and lunch at no charge.
- Children may still purchase a la carte items such as extra milk or additional food items.
- If a child moves to another school, parents will need to contact the food service office for clarification on meal service at their new school.
- If parents have deposited money on their child's meal account, they can request a refund or leave the money on the account for purchase of a la carte items.
- Free/reduced meals are still available at other Campbell County Schools for students who qualify.
