## **Explanation of Private School Services, Funding, and Delivery**

707 KAR 1:370 (Children with disabilities enrolled in private schools) specifies in basic requirements (Section 4) that the public school is required to determine eligibility of students enrolled in private schools within our attendance boundary, to implement a service plan, and spend a proportionate amount of federal funding based on child count in order to do so.

Further, in Section 5 of the regulation, it is required that public schools consult with representatives of these private schools before the beginning of each school year. That was done in Campbell County on June 12, 2020. The principals of the parochial schools were all in attendance and signed the affirmation of consultation. A representative of a home school did the same via mail (by request).

Service delivery by Campbell County Schools for 2020-2021 will be:

- Pursuant to law, the public school district makes the final determination regarding the items we are consulting you about, as no private school student has the right to IDEA services and parentally-placed private school students do not have a right to the same type or amount of IDEA services the students would receive in public school.
- For the 2020-2021 school year, Campbell County Schools will offer speech/language services to eligible private school students on a weekly basis at the St. Mary and St. Joseph (Cold Spring) sites only. The home school student will receive services on the CCS campus.
- Preschool students who are placed by their parents in a private school do not qualify for service plans. If a preschool student meets eligibility criteria for speech services, that student must be enrolled in the public school by their parent in order to receive services under an IEP.

In addition, each time a student in the private school gets a new plan, the following information is presented to and agreed upon by both the parent and the private school representative:

### **Kentucky Administrative Regulations: 707 KAR 1:370**

- *A private school child with a disability does not have the individual right to receive all of the special education and related services that he/she would receive if enrolled in a public school.*
- *A private school child with a disability may receive a different amount of services than children with disabilities enrolled in public schools. These services are specified on a Services Plan, not an IEP.*
- *When a parent decides to place his child with a disability in a private school after the District offered a free and appropriate public education the District is not required to pay for the cost of the private education.*
- *Parents may file a state-level complaint if the District failed in its responsibilities to evaluate and determine eligibility for private school children with disabilities. Parents may not file state-level complaints on other IDEA issues, such as failure to provide services contained in a Services Plan.*
- *Services provided to a private school child with a disability may be provided at a site determined by the District.*
