
To our Donuts with Dad volunteers—for taking the time to put together what will certainly be a great morning on April 20th. Will you be there Dad?



Nurse's Notes

As we approach the end of the year, I would like to stress children are not permitted to bring meds to school on the bus or bring them into the building from the car line. Only parents can deliver medicine to the school nurse's office. I cannot give medication to your child unless I have a note from the doctor. Over-the-counter medication also cannot be given without a doctor's order.

If you find that your child has contracted head lice, please call the school and let us know. The matter is kept confidential but we need to know. If you find your child with head lice, they need to be live lice and nit free before returning to school. They cannot ride the bus until they have been cleared by me. If they are nit free I can clear them to reenter school. If you need information when dealing with lice, please call me.

Fifth grade parents remember that after your student turns 11, they are due for more vaccinations. The new state requirements say the students need a Tetanus booster, a second Varicella (Chicken Pox) booster and a Meningococcal vaccination before they enter middle school. They are also required to get a new physical exam. If you get these requirements finished before the end of the year, you can return the documents to me and I will enter the information in the computer to transfer to the Middle school. If you have any questions, please feel free to call me.

Kindergarten and Preschool students must have a total of 2 Varicella vaccinations before they return to school in the fall. Please remember that Immunizations are required and must be on file at school no later than 2 weeks after school starts. Physical exams are due 30 days after school starts. Dental and vision exams are also a state requirement and must be completed and on file by January 1. If your child needs to see the doctor, remember doctor appointments are hard to get later in the summer, so call early. If your child takes medication at school, I will be sending forms home in mid- May. These also are due at the beginning



Arts & Humanities—D. Hutton 3rd


Lego Robotics

CHARACTER WORD FOR APRIL: ENTHUSIASM


Enthusiasm is expressing joy in each task as I give my best effort. Showing great excitement for or interest in a subject or cause.
